Open House Night in Astronomy on Thursday, December 3, 2009 at 7:30 p.m., at 101 Otto Behrend Science Center, hosted by Dr. Roger Knacke, Professor of Physics and Astronomy. The theme will be THE CHRISTMAS STAR. Professor Roger Knacke will discuss what the Star of Bethlehem might have been. Many theories for the star have been proposed—that it was a comet, or a meteor, or an exploding star, or a conjunction of planets. Dr. Knacke will examine the Bible's description of the star, and compare it with astronomical evidence to suggest a plausible explanation. A computer simulation of the skies over Bethlehem more than 2,000 years ago will show what people might have seen and interpreted as a miraculous star.

Admission is free and the event is open to the public. The lecture is intended for a non-technical audience. Astronomical observing from Penn State Behrend's Mehalso Observatory will follow the lecture, weather permitting. For more information, contact the school at 814-898-6105.

Attention: Juniors, Seniors & Parents: Union City Area High School will present its annual Financial Aid Workshop, *Tuesday, November 24, 2009*, at 6:30 in the LGI. The presenter will be, Amy Sloan, representative from the Regional PA High Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA). Parents and students will learn what they need to do to apply for all types of financial aid, including completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which is required to qualify for most student aid programs such as the Pennsylvania State Grant, Federal Pell Grant, institutional awards and low-cost federal student and parent loans.
